RE: Horse Health Update

Strangles

On Saturday May 8, 2021, a horse on the grounds at Red Shores Charlottetown had been identified as showing clinical signs of Streptococcus Equi (Strangles).

The horse was examined by a veterinarian, who recommended immediate removal from the grounds and isolation, which was completed that day. Subsequent testing on this horse confirmed the presence of the bacteria.

Ten other horses in the impacted barn have test levels which indicate some level of exposure to the Streptococcus Equi (Strangles) bacteria however are not showing any clinical signs and are being monitored daily.

Based upon veterinary guidance, these horses have been isolated in one area of the barn.

A monitoring and testing protocol have been established and implemented by the Atlantic Veterinary College and the attending veterinarians. No entries from the impacted barn are being accepted for competition at this time.

All horse owners are urged to follow bio- security protocols, and closely monitor their horses' temperatures twice daily.
